

REGULAR MEETING OF THE MILTON TOWNSHIP BOARD

July 10, 2018

A Regular Meeting of the Milton Township Board was held in the Board Room of the Milton Town Hall, 1492 N. Main Street, Wheaton, Illinois, on Tuesday, July 10, 2018, for the audit of town bills followed immediately by a business meeting.

Board Members Present: Supervisor O. Chris Heidorn - Clerk Gail P. Hinkle - Trustees Sal Falbo, Yadav Nathwani David Molitor and John Monino. Also Present: Bob Jacobsen and Marty Keller.

The business meeting was called to order by Chairman Heidorn at 6:30 p.m. Bob Jacobsen led the Pledge of Allegiance. A quorum was present and acting, and due notice had been mailed in compliance with the Open Meetings Act.

Trustee Molitor moved, seconded by Trustee Nathwani, to approve the agenda as presented. The motion passed by voice vote.

Trustee Molitor moved, seconded by Trustee Monino, that the minutes of the Regular Meeting on June 12, 2018, be approved as submitted. The motion passed by voice vote.

Having concluded their audit of the Township bills in the earlier segment of the meeting, Chairman Heidorn moved, seconded by Trustee Molitor that the bills having been audited be paid and charged to the proper accounts, and the certificates of accounts be filed by the Clerk for inspection by the inhabitants of the Township. Following discussion, the motion passed on the following roll-call vote: Trustees Falbo, Nathwani, Molitor, Monino and Chairman Heidorn. (5 Ayes), (0 Nays).

Public Forum – None.

Chairman's Report:

- General Assistance/Food Pantry – The Board was issued the monthly General Assistance report for the month of June.
- New landscaping of bushes and plants were recently planted in front of the Township building.
- Weed Program – Mr. Heidorn reported the weed complaints were numerous but under control, with the assistance of Ronna Johnson. Chairman Heidorn commented the Township, at present, does not have a County Deputy Sheriff to assist in overseeing the weed/grass cuttings of the unincorporated areas. The Township is in the process of selecting a new Deputy to assist in patrolling the unincorporated areas. Discussion followed.
- Miscellaneous/Other – The Township Office was opened to the public on the 4th of July, as a cooling/water station. The public appreciated the convenience.

Clerk Hinkle – The 2018 Education District Class will be held on August 9, 2018. Those interested in attending, please contact the Clerk. The Township Officials of Illinois Annual Educational Conference will be held on November 11-13, 2018. Clerk Hinkle mentioned there is a conflict with our November 13, 2018 Board Meeting. After discussion, Trustee Nathwani moved, seconded by Trustee Monino to move the November Board Meeting date to November 6, 2018. The motion passed by voice vote.

Seniors Committee - S.A.L.T. - In the absence of Chairman Smith, Mr. Heidorn gave a report on the 2018 upcoming Speakers & Events. Trustee Monino reported Mr. Smith is helping with the 3rd Annual Homeless Veterans Stand Down, located at the DuPage County Fairgrounds. This event supports homeless veterans by providing medical and dental services, along with VA, Social Security information. They also provide haircuts, showers and meals.

Citizen Corps/CERT – Director Keller reported, in the month of June, twenty-five CERT members attended a training class for Flaggers, and the DuPage County Health Department conducted a Narcan training session for forty CERT members. Discussion followed.

Cemeteries Authority – Chairman Jacobsen reported on meeting Mr. Joseph Cooley, who was interested in finding his ancestors buried at the Jewell Grove Cemetery. He will be assisting Mr. Jacobsen in collecting more data on the Cooley family. The Pleasant Hill ceremony held on June 30, 2018 was a great success but, the weather was extremely hot. The iron fence located at the Jewell Grove Cemetery is being worked on by two machinists/blacksmiths. The Village of Carol Stream had contacted Mr. Jacobsen asking for his assistance in gathering information on the St. Stephen's Cemetery. Mr. Jacobsen obliged in giving the Village the history of the cemetery. Discussion followed.

Chairman Heidorn announced there will be a Township Open House scheduled for the month of September. Discussion followed.

Mr. Heidorn announced there will be a new publication of a Township Newsletter. This newsletter will be handled by Penni Cannova and Chris Heidorn. Ms. Cannova will be interviewing the Board of Trustees, Officials and other employees for their insight and input regarding our Township Government.

Trustees – Trustee Molitor sadly announced the death of Kyle Ryan Rahal, who had lived many years in unincorporated Glen Ellyn. He was a neighbor, and a friend of Mr. Molitor and his family. Mr. Rahal was only 31 years old when he passed away from an over dose of drugs.

Trustee Molitor reported on mowing and spraying the Butterfield sidewalk between Park and Lambert Roads. The fences were covered with poison ivy and poison Sumac.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Trustee Nathwani moved, seconded by Trustee Monino that the meeting stand adjourned. The motion carried by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
