

REGULAR MEETING OF THE MILTON TOWNSHIP BOARD

August 14, 2018

A Regular Meeting of the Milton Township Board was held in the Board Room of the Milton Town Hall, 1492 N. Main Street, Wheaton, Illinois, on Tuesday, August 14, 2018, for the audit of town bills followed immediately by a business meeting.

Board Members Present: Supervisor O. Chris Heidorn - Clerk Gail P. Hinkle - Trustees Sal Falbo, Yadav Nathwani, David Molitor and John Monino. Also Present: Robert Krzyzewski, Chuck Smith, Bob Jacobsen, Marty Keller and Drew Ellis.

The business meeting was called to order by Chairman Heidorn at 6:30 p.m. Dr. Bob Krzyzewski led the Pledge of Allegiance. A quorum was present and acting, and due notice had been mailed in compliance with the Open Meetings Act.

Trustee Falbo moved, seconded by Trustee Molitor, to approve the agenda as presented. The motion passed by voice vote.

Trustee Molitor moved, seconded by Trustee Monino, that the minutes of the Regular Meeting on July 10, 2018, be approved as submitted. The motion passed by voice vote.

Having concluded their audit of the Township bills in the earlier segment of the meeting, Chairman Heidorn moved, seconded by Trustee Molitor that the bills having been audited be paid and charged to the proper accounts, and the certificates of accounts be filed by the Clerk for inspection by the inhabitants of the Township. Following discussion, the motion passed on the following roll-call vote: Trustees Falbo, Nathwani, Molitor, Monino and Chairman Heidorn. (5 Ayes), (0 Nays).

Public Forum – None.

Chairman's Report:

- General Assistance/Food Pantry – The Board was issued the General Assistance report for the month of July. Chairman Heidorn reported the weekly “Food Recovery” Program has been temporarily discontinued. Discussion followed.
- MAD & WNV – Chairman Heidorn had authorized a 5th mosquito spraying in conjunction with our neighboring towns. A West Nile case, in Wheaton, was recently reported. Discussion followed.
- Weed Program – Mr. Heidorn is still receiving many weed complaints. Ronna Johnson has been assisting Mr. Heidorn in taking pictures of the weed complaint locations.
- Miscellaneous/Other – Mr. Heidorn reported on a failure with our security camera system. For the past several months, Mr. Heidorn has not been able to upload sound on the camera system. Chairman Heidorn is looking into upgrading our security system.
- Website - Mr. Heidorn is looking into finding a new website design company. After researching, the company hired by the Assessor's office, will be designing our new web page.
- Clerk Hinkle – No Report.

Seniors Committee - S.A.L.T. Committee Chairman Mr. Chuck Smith, gave a report on the SALT website not being secured. The site is now updated with the help and expertise of Penni Cannova. The Web Page is now up to date and more accessible to the Milton Township Seniors.

The Annual Auto Inspection will take place on October 9, 2018 at Fire Station #1, in Wheaton.

The September S.A.L.T. Meeting will host a guest speaker from Spectrios Institute for Low Vision.

Cemeteries Authority – Bob Jacobsen presented to the Township Board a copy of his presentation to the Carol Stream Elected Officials and the Village Administrators on the history of St. Stephen's Cemetery.

The Wheaton Park District had asked Mr. Jacobsen to loan his records and documents on the history of golf to be placed on display at the Arrow Head Golf Club. Mr. Jacobsen, with the help of Marty Keller, created a catalogue of an assortment of golf paraphernalia that was also presented.

Mr. Jacobsen had recently visited the Boardman Cemetery that had been restored by the Bolingbrook Historical Society, located in DuPage Township.

Family Day at St. Stephen Cemetery will be held on September 8, 2018.

Citizen Corps & CERT – Director Marty Keller recently met with County Coroner, Richard Jorgensen. The meeting was to discuss a plan to prepare for a disaster in DuPage County. The County needs volunteers to be trained in a wide variety of skills; identifying and taking tactical records, moving bodies, etc. A training class will be held this fall for the CERT leadership. In the future, the CERT volunteers will have the opportunity to take the class. Discussion followed.

Trustee's Comments – Trustee Molitor reported on the Butterfield sidewalk. Mr. Molitor sprayed the area for poison ivy and poison oak. He had also mowed the sidewalk area. There still needs to be trimming of tree branches that hang over the sidewalk. A portion of the sidewalk needs to be replaced as well.

Township Newsletter – Chris Heidorn, Penni Cannova and Johanna Karmis will be in charge of writing the Township Newsletter. The first draft of the newsletter is scheduled for the end of August. All residents in Milton Township will receive this newsletter. Discussion followed.
