BRUSH PICKUP PROGRAM IN UNINCORPORATED MILTON TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, as of July 1, 1990, state law mandates that brush is no longer considered as "garbage" and must be disposed of separately; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Milton Township and the Milton Township Highway Commissioner recognize the need for a brush removal program in unincorporated Milton Township;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of Milton Township and the Milton Township Highway Commissioner that the following Brush Pickup Program be adopted.

The Brush Pickup Program will consist of two pickups a year - one beginning the first week of May and one beginning the second week in September. Storm related brush pickup will be handled by the Highway Commissioner as necessary.


DEFINITION: Brush is hereby defined as trimmings from bushes or shrubs, as well as tree branches from trimming or pruning trees. Logs, stumps, thorn bush, grass clippings, flowers, weeds, plants, leaves, lumber, or anything in plastic bags or other such containers shall not be considered brush.


GUIDELINES: Brush must not be placed on the parkway earlier than the Sunday before the scheduled Monday pickup in the area. All brush must be cut in lengths under four feet and no larger than two inches in diameter. All brush placed on the parkway for pickup hereunder must be securely bundled with twine, and each bundle shall not exceed 25 pounds in weight. Items which do not conform to these guidelines will not be picked up by the Township and will be the sole responsibility of the Homeowner as to their proper disposal. All questions relative to this program shall be directed to the Milton Township Highway Department.

NON-COMPLIANCE: Upon receipt of a written non-compliance notice, the Homeowner shall remove all items designated in the non-compliance notice from the parkway no later than the first Monday following the date of the non-compliance notice and the Homeowner shall not again place such items in the parkway for pickup by the Township until full compliance with the guidelines set forth in this Resolution.

This Resolution supersedes Resolution No. 90-3 dated May 8, 1990, and shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, unless rescinded by the Milton Township Highway Commissioner.
