Year 2022 in my opinion has gone by very fast. The Team has accomplished a lot. I thought you might be interested in some facts about the team. The Team participated in over 65 events/ and or trainings this year. The team responded to West Chicago and DuPage County Forrest Preserve for an Emergency Response. We performed eight training sessions. For example the SAR & Transportation in the iconic Wheaton Bowl and many others. We graduated 77 students in 42 hours and another 36 in make-up sessions. The teams total volunteer hours added up to 10,411.00 hours x \$ 29.95 = a grand total of \$311,809.20 this is what we saved the various DuPage County Community. 233 Cert Volunteers volunteered out of 1127 that makes 20.67%. Still 20% does 80%

CPR/AED -- Jeanine Moore & Jan Gerzevske

Do you know how many chest compressions per minute are required to do CPR correctly? Should you bend your elbows when doing CPR? When should you call 911? Should an AED be used if it is available? All these questions were answered by Lt Al Katana at the Naperville Safety Building on Aurora Ave when he taught the CPR class on October 19, 2022.





Following Al's instruction, each of the participants had the opportunity to practice "lighting up" the practice dummy. When the light is lit, CPR is being done correctly. Doing CPR correctly—100-120 compressions per minute is tiring. After 1 ½ to 2 minutes, participant were ready to let another class member take over. Fourteen people which included six members of the newly graduated Indigo Class, received their CPR certification.



What's in your bag?

People often ask me, "What should I carry in my go bag?" I usually answer in the same way, "That all depends." I know this is a non-answer / answer, but it really does depend on a number of variables. What a person carries in their go -bag is a personal thing. One person may consider an item indispensable; while another thinks it is just unnecessary additional weight. The funny thing is, both can be right.

When deciding what to carry, a number of factors should be considered. First, is the item a want or a need? Only you can decide this. I may feel that carrying a roll of Tums is a want (in case of an upset stomach), while someone else sees it as a need (perhaps that person has recurring acid reflux). Second, how much space does the item take up and how much does it weigh? Again, perhaps I'm willing to carry a heavy or bulky item if I see it as a need.

Another way to begin the decision making process is to envision an extended call out, say overnight, and then ask yourself, what would I want to have with me to make this more tolerable? During this call out, what types of tasks am I likely to be asked to perform? Is it likely that I will be setting up a field hospital? Probably not, so perhaps the massive EMT trauma bag can stay at home or in the car.



Prepare supplies for home, work, and vehicle Emergencies can happen anywhere.



Another good place to look for ideas is the list of items provided during CERT training. Do you foresee a need for all of the items or just some of them? The training instructors can offer guidelines of what may have been needed in the past. Take advantage of their years of experience and don't be afraid to ask them for their ideas and advice. They won't mind, I promise. Fellow CERT members are also willing to discuss their equipment choices. Many in fact, love to discuss this topic in depth; for some, their kit is a source of pride.

Remember that more is not always better. You need to stay mobile and be able to go the distance. Probably the best way to determine what you'll need is to get out there and use your kit. Load up your bag, put it on and go for a hike or mow the lawn. How did you hold up? Training opportunities, like the Metra train experience, are invaluable for the amount of feedback you'll get, especially from your feet and back! It will become evident pretty quickly which items are useful and which are dead weight.



One last thing, check your kit frequently for dead batteries, expired food and medicine items. There are few things worse than carrying around an item and when you really need it, it doesn't work or is expired. And don't forget to add some cold weather gear now too.


