MILTON TOWNSHIP PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

- 1. All Township Meetings subject to the Illinois Open Meetings Act shall include a Public Comment item on the Agenda.
- 2. Public Comment shall be limited to 3 minutes per person, unless extended by a vote of the Town Board. The total Public Comment time allotment shall not to exceed 30 minutes.
- 3. Speakers will be recognized in the order in which their request for Public Comment is submitted.
- 4. Speakers may substitute their Public Comment with written comments, which may also be submitted to supplement the Speaker's Public Comments.
- 5. Speakers are requested to state their name for the record.
- 6. All Public Comments shall be directed to the Supervisor.
- 7. Public Comments may be made on any Agenda item, or any subject matter pertaining to Milton Township. Public Comments at a Special Meeting shall be limited to the topics on the Agenda.
- 8. Groups of Speakers on the same subject matter may select a representative Speaker to avoid repetition.
- 9. Public Comments should be made in a civil respectful manner, with Speakers avoiding threatening or disruptive comments and actions. Use of profanity is strictly prohibited.
- 10. The Supervisor, or her designee, or the Chair of any Township Committee Meeting, may halt or suspend Public Comment due to non-compliance with these guidelines, and may delay the completion of Public Comment, due to the number of Speakers; or if said Public Comment interferes with the Board's ability to transact Township business.

ABOUT US

Milton Township, through its General Assistance Department, operates an on-site Food Pantry for individuals and families in need here in Milton Township. Begun by office staff bringing in food from home to help those who visited our General Assistance office, the Pantry was incorporated in 2002 as an Illinois not-for-profit and granted 501(c)(3) status by the IRS. It is entirely supported by donations from the community – no tax dollars are used and all donations are fully taxdeductible.



WANT TO HELP?

The food pantry is always looking for support. Volunteering is a great way to help support your community. If you don't have the time to volunteer, consider donating to the food pantry. We are always in need of hygienic products, canned food, diapers, cereal and monetary donations.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Year over year we have seen significant increases in the use of the food pantry. Over 1000 individuals are now served monthly who are facing food insecurity. Quality food is given to our neighbors through the Milton Township Food Pantry. This includes produce, dairy, eggs, meat, and shelf stable foods. Halal foods are stocked and items for those with specific dietary needs are made available dependent on donations. A pet pantry is a newer service.

Growth in need has been matched by growth in donor partnerships. Milton Township relies on a network of grantors, donors, and companies who share generously. We thank DuPage County for a 2024 grant for a new refrigerated box truck. Other donors provide, monthly reusable shopping bags to make our food pantry more eco-friendly.

General Assistance

General Assistance is a state-mandated program for those residents who do not fit into categories administered by Social Security or the Department of Human Services. It provides a monthly grant to a single adult with no income seeking employment or a determination regarding disability benefits. General Assistance can cover utilities, food, or work related experience. Call to learn more or make an appointment.



Emergency Assistance

We provide emergency assistance for residents who meet our income guidelines and struggle to pay their rent/mortgage or have a disconnect notice for gas, electric, or water. Call to learn more or make an appointment.



LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program)

DuPage County administers the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). This assistance program can help eligible households with gas and/or electric bills. The Township assists in filling out and accepting applications. Call to learn more or to make an appointment.



Food Pantry

We work hard to ensure that no one in need goes hungry. Our Food Pantry, 501(c)3, is supported by donations from the community and operated by volunteers. No tax dollars are used and all donations are fully tax-deductible. Our Pantry is open Tues-Thursday from 9:00 a.m. - 12 p.m or by appointment.



C.E.R.T.

The Milton Township Community Emergency Response Team was created to help the community in times of crisis.. Throughout the year, they also provide assistance for many community events. They offer ongoing training opportunities. C.E.R.T. is completely volunteer based.



Senior Programs

Throughout the year, the township will host different activities and events that keep seniors involved. We also have a lending closet of gently used medical equipment for anyone to utilize free of charge.



Transportation Services

We offer assistance with the applications of RTA Passes, Ride DuPage and Benefit Access. We also offer temporary handicap placards.



Vehicle Sticker Renewal

Renew your vehicle sticker here. Service fee of \$5 for each renewal. Residents can pay with cash or check. *Note: vehicles must have passed an emissions test.



Assessor

The Assessor is charged with establishing fair and accurate assessments for all real estate in the Township. This assures the equitable and fair distribution of property tax burden amongst all taxpayers. Our courteous and friendly staff assist taxpayers with their assessment questions and with senior exemptions and freezes in our easily accessible office.



Highway Department

Our Highway Commissioner and staff work to keep 80 miles of road in repair, clear and safe for driving. Through intergovernmental agreements, the Highway Department assists municipalities and other townships in recovering from severe weather events such as floods, windstorms, and tornados.



Cemeteries Authority

Milton oversees the protection preservation, and care of three Civil War-era cemeteries. We host cemetery commemorations each year in honor of our veterans and to promote interest in the study of local history.



Special Programs

Additional programs that Milton Township also provides: Mosquito Abatement, Special Police District (extra patrol for the unincorporated areas), free Notary services and Voter Registration.



708 Mental Health Board

The 708 board was established for the purpose of helping community needs in the areas of mental health, intellectual and developmental disabilities, as well as substance abuse. The 708 board has monthly meetings to discuss these topics. They also grant funds to organizations within Milton Township that pertain to those areas.



S.A.L.T. (Seniors And Law Enforcement Together)

Stay safe from scams and know what's happening in the community from your local Police Department at our monthly meetings. SALT is a service we provide that brings seniors, law enforcement, and local agencies together.



Veterans Recognition

This township works to make our veterans feel appreciated and respected, resulting in the creation of our veterans honor wall. Throughout the year we also host several different events that go toward helping veterans in need.
